
# **FCBC Easter Term**

The most exiting event of the term has been our new boat: the Nicky Padfield. Thank you to Nicky for naming and breaking in the new boat at the naming ceremony!

Whilst for W1 there was a lot to work on, the crew tried their best and showed fighting spirit and had great fun during the term. In Mays we had a great row over on the first day and unfortunately some brutal bumps on the second, third and final day by Jesus, Darwin and Emmanual. (The Nicky Padfield survived with no major injuries!). This means W1 dropped down 3 places now lying 7<sup>th</sup> in May Bumps Division 4. It's been a tough term and a challenging May Bumps but the women's side has come out stronger and more experienced.

It has not been the most successful year in terms of results but we have much to look forward to in the next year starting with our training camp in early October. The new Women's Captain is Chloe Withers for the next year 2014-15.

Due to exams, M1 didn't get the full crew together for a few weeks. The City Head-to-Head showed this, coming 11<sup>th</sup> out of 13 M1 crews entering, despite a strong first leg. Nottingham City Regatta gave us some useful multilane experience, entering the novice category, and having outright won our first heat with clear water, came an annoying 4<sup>th</sup> in the final, just 0.2 seconds behind 3<sup>rd</sup>.

M1 had a strong performance in May Bumps this year, with the crew punching above their weight. Day 1 – Strong row over with Girton behind & 1 whistle on Emma in front. Day 2 – Row over in front of Girton, who were then bumped by Peterhouse. Day 3 – Bumped by Peterhouse on Ditton corner. In our attempt to push away (which almost work) we gained on Emma, putting us within a length of them. Day 4 – Exiting row over ahead of Churchill (overlap down the reach). This puts M1 down just 1 place, placing 14<sup>th</sup> in division 1. Peterhouse were definitely on the up, and so this is a result to be extremely pleased with! We've upped the training and are starting to get back the M1 attitude and crew focus needed to row in division 1.
